Bridging the Gap

For the students in Mr. Dan Majka's Pre-Chemistry/Pre-Physics class, a recent experiment taught them a lesson about vectors while giving them an opportunity to let their creative side shine through. Students were given the task of designing and building a bridge while taking into account such factors as tension loads, force vectors, efficiency of mass versus load carried, and truss design. Once the bridges were built, each one was load tested to the point of destruction to determine the efficiency ratio. They determined how much weight the bridge could hold before being destroyed and divided that by the weight of the bridge before destruction.

There were a few requirements the students had to abide by when designing their bridge. The bridge had to span a make believe river that was 30 cm wide. It had to be high enough over the water to allow a boat that was 7 cm high to pass under it. It had to be as light as possible. The wood pieces could not be completely coated with glue; the glue could only be applied where the pieces of wood touched. No more than two pieces of wood could be glued together to form a single beam going in the same direction.

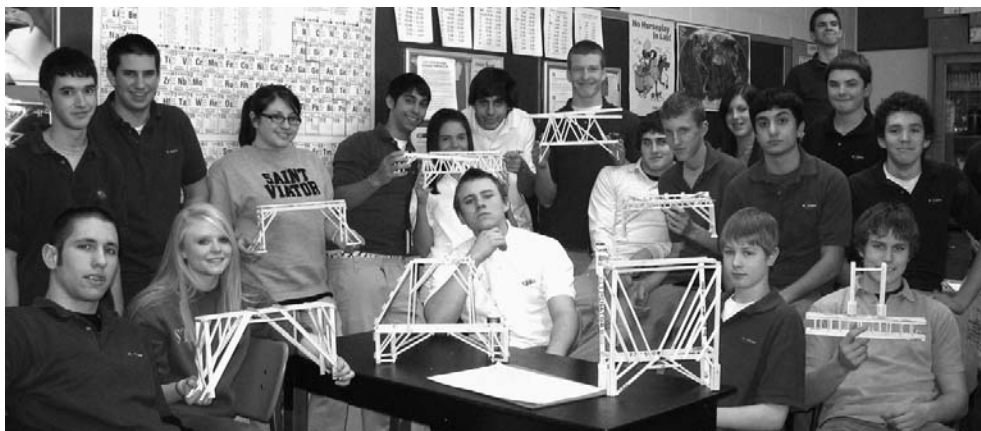
Eric Abrahamian '10, Joshua Trimble '10 and Danny Sheehan '10 were paired up for this experiment. They nicknamed their bridge the "Eliminator" because they felt that their bridge would dominate the competition. "This project is a good break from the usual work," said Eric

Abrahamian. Danny Sheehan had his sights set on being the team with the best overall design. "If we win this competition, I'm going to Disney World," he said.

Unfortunately, it looks like the boys will not be traveling to Disney as a result of their bridge making skills. Even though their design was able to hold all the weight (20,000 grams) readily available for this experiment, **Tianna Giovenco '10, Michael Broccolino '10, and Mark Silverston '09** designed a lighter bridge that was able to hold 16,000 grams. Tianna, Michael, and Mark's bridge proved to have a slightly better efficiency ratio at 499 than Eric, Joshua and Danny's bridge at 420.

Attention Parents of Sophomore Daughters – Ring Selection Time is Coming Soon

As you and your daughter discuss the style of her Saint Viator High School class ring, I invite you to consider a special option, the "Traditional." It is referred to as the "Traditional" ring because of the connection to Sacred Heart of Mary, Saint Viator's sister school. The cut of the blue stone is the same as that of the Sacred Heart of Mary rings worn by students from the first graduating class in 1965 to the last one in 1987. The letters "SHM" were engraved in the stone.

At the time when Sacred Heart of Mary and Saint Viator came together as one school, students on one of the planning

committees requested that the blue rectangular cut stone be one of the options made available to the young women. That is where the "Traditional" ring option gets its name.

The "Traditional" ring is very unique. Some students choose it so that they can be easily identified as a Saint Viator student (and later as a Saint Viator alumna). A growing number of SVHS students are choosing the "Traditional" style. Last year, 42 young women from the Class of 2009 chose the "Traditional" ring. Only three of those juniors had moms who attended Sacred Heart of Mary.

The "Traditional" ring is also a style that can be worn well beyond the high school years. There are many stories from alumnae about how they have been on a plane, in a store, at a place of work, etc. and have met another alumna because she was wearing her unique ring. Kathy Kenney Supplitt '77 had a store clerk in Boston recognize her ring.

So you when you talk with your daughter about what style of ring will be the best for her, think about the "Traditional" ring and the history behind it.

ROAR Literary Magazine

ROAR publishes creative writing (short fiction, creative nonfiction, poetry) and visual art (photography, drawing, painting, sculpture) from students and faculty in two issues per year.

Mr. Steve Halle '97, the faculty moderator for ROAR, started the club in 2004, addressing a need Mr. Jerry Leitner brought to his attention. "Mr. Leitner mentioned the need for a literary magazine in a Viator Voice interview and also in English Department meetings. I felt like it was a project I could take on," said Halle. "There was no literary magazine here when I was in school; poems and stuff were put in the Viator yearbook. They later added a 'Poet's Corner' column to the Viator Voice, which was great but not an ideal location."

The first issue of ROAR came out in spring 2004. "It was tough to figure out the best way to go for the magazine. I didn't have desktop publishing expertise and hadn't worked in magazine publishing," said Mr. Halle, "but I felt a space for creativity was necessary for students."

Mr. Halle decided to keep production simple, creating "a do-it-yourself or punk element to the magazine, like a zine. Matt Martinez '06, one of my editors, liked to

say 'ROAR is the underground club of Saint Viator.'" This independent mentality allows the magazine to be produced inexpensively, although Mr. Halle considers sales important. "It's important to write and get it out there - that has value, but it's also important for other people to validate creativity, which is why selling ROAR is also important to me."

ROAR features several different ways to participate. Each year editors are selected by an application process as the school year begins. This year's editors include: **Courtney Olender '08** and **Brittany Locke '08**, Co-Editors-in-Chief; **Annemarie Puma '08**, Visual Arts Editor; **Janice Guzon '10**, Creative Writing Editor; **Gabriela Limonciello '10** and **Cheyenne Egelston '10**, Promotions

Editors; and **Melanie Slawny '10**, Sales Editor. Editors do all the work for ROAR, generating and choosing submissions to publish, creating the style and layout of the magazine, and selling it once it's complete.

Students can also participate by contributing creative writing or art. Submissions may be sent to Mr. Halle in digital form by e-mail (shalle@saintviator.com) or by hard copy in person. "The hardest part is finding writers and artists who want to turn in work for publication," says Mr. Halle, "If they're anything like I was at that age, many students probably feel they're taking a big risk by publishing creative work because it's usually quite personal, but it's never as big a deal as it appears."

Students take a STAND

The Student Anti-Genocide coalition, STAND, will be bringing a petition and peaceful protest to the Chicago Chinese Consulate and NBC Studios. The petition for the Chinese Consulate will ask China to stop supplying the Sudanese government with weapons and to pressure Sudan to comply with all U.N. resolutions. The petition states their involvement with the genocide in Darfur is not being overlooked; it is tarnishing their image as the host country in the 2008 Beijing Olympics. The petition for NBC asks the broadcasting company to publicize China's involvement in the genocide in Darfur along with its coverage of the 2008 Beijing Olympics. On Thursday, April 10, the members of STAND will head to Chicago to deliver the petitions. They will hand-deliver their signed petition to the Chinese Consulate and stage a peaceful protest outside their front door. They will then head to the NBC5 Studio to stage another peaceful protest in time for the evening broadcast. Students also hope to reach out to passersby and educate them on the situation in the Sudan through handouts and conversation.

To help them gain momentum for their petition, STAND will host a screening of the documentary Facing Sudan, on Thursday, April 3. Facing Sudan is produced by Bruce David Janu, who visited Saint Viator earlier in the year for a presentation to educate the students on the crisis in Sudan. On Tuesday, April 8 the members of STAND will introduce the petition to the entire school community at the end of the all-school Mass. Students will be given the opportunity to sign the petitions during lunch periods on April 8 and 9.

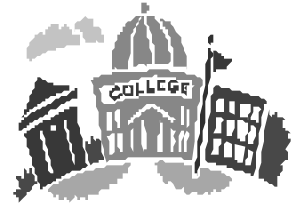
2008-09 U.S. CONSTITUTION TEST DATES

Brother Robert C. Ruhl, C.S.V. Alumni Memorial Grant to be Established

Our Saint Viator High School community continues to mourn the loss of one of our own, and one of our very best teachers, Brother Robert C. Ruhl, C.S.V., who died suddenly on February 2, 2008. In the literally hundreds of personal tributes offered by his students on the Saint Viator High School website and on Facebook, they spoke of how Brother Ruhl was uniquely able to use not only literature, grammar, writing and poetry, but also his interest in music, theatre, movies and trivia to reveal the mysteries of life, the values of the Gospel, and the lessons we need as we grow and mature in life. This outpouring of fond memories and overwhelming support offered by so many represents a dramatic validation of his vocation and the Viatorian mission.

Since Brother Ruhl's unexpected passing, many alumni and current and past parents have made unsolicited gifts in his memory to Saint Viator High School's Tuition Assistance Endowment. In support of these efforts, an anonymous donor has come forward and generously offered to match any and all contributions for this purpose up to \$25,000.

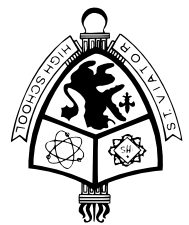
