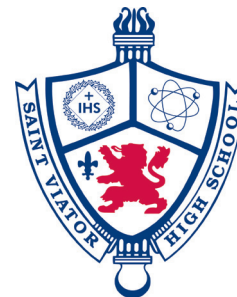

Drug Testing Policy

In August 2007, Saint Viator implemented a mandatory drug testing program in an effort to maintain and enhance a drug-free environment. Each fall, all students are tested for the presence of illegal drugs for the 90 days prior to test date. Random, weekly tests continue throughout the school year.
