- Demonstrate financial need based on the PSAS Student Aid Form for 2009-10
- Complete the Saint Viator High School Grant/Scholarship Application for 2009-10
- Meet the financial aid guidelines and policies
- Uphold the standards of discipline as written in the student handbook
- Abide by additional criteria set forth

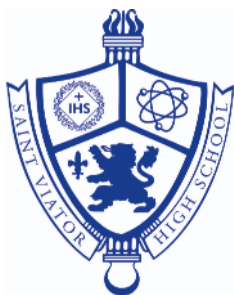
IMPORTANT DATES:

Wednesday, January 7, 2009 – 7:00 p.m. – Nora Boka, Controller, and Rev. Robert M. Egan, C.S.V., President, will host a Tuition Assistance Seminar at Saint Viator High School to review the application process and answer questions about the Tuition Assistance Program.

Saturday, January 10, 2009 – 8:00 a.m. – Class of 2013 Entrance Exam. Applications for grants and scholarships, as well as the Student Aid Form for 2009-10, are distributed and available in both the Business and Administration Offices.

Monday, March 2, 2009 – Postmark deadline for the PSAS Application and Student Aid Form for 2009-10.

The Clerics of St. Viator founded Saint Viator High School to meet the educational and spiritual needs of young people from diverse and various socio-economic backgrounds. To ensure that this mission remains accessible to as many students as possible, the Tuition Assistance Program was established to aid families with the desire to be part of the Viatorian tradition. Through the generosity of our founding and sponsoring community, the Clerics of St. Viator, our alumni, parents, friends and benefactors, this program has grown significantly over the years and continues to be a priority for the Board of Trustees and the Advancement Office.

The main objective of the Saint Viator High School Tuition Assistance Program is to help families afford a Saint Viator education for their child(ren). Saint Viator's Tuition Assistance Program has grown from \$495,300 awarded in 2001-02 to \$858,735 awarded in 2007-08 – a 73% increase in six years. Our objective is to increase the dollars offered for Tuition Assistance to \$1 million by 2010-11. More than 20% of the student population received some form of tuition assistance for the 2007-08 school year.

As of July 2008, over 85% of those who applied for tuition assistance received an award during the 2008-09 academic year (228 out of 263 applicants). The individual award amounts ranged from a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of \$6,000 and are based on a case-by-case evaluation of each application.

In order to qualify for Tuition Assistance, each family must complete and submit the Student Aid Form and PSAS Application by the posted deadline. Please review the following information and consider applying for tuition assistance through one or more of the programs available. Tuition assistance is awarded based on financial need.

Please note: the Illinois High School Association has determined that no athletic scholarships are to be awarded at any high school in Illinois. Saint Viator High School strictly adheres to the rules and regulations of the IHSA.

GRANTS are awarded on the basis of financial need.

Title	Amount	Description
Viatorian Community Grant	\$1,000 - \$4,900	Established by the Clerics of St. Viator, Chicago Province. This program is the primary fund for tuition assistance. No separate application. (multiple awards/renewable)
Rev. Thomas R. von Behren, C.S.V. Grant	\$4,900	Established by the Parents' Club in 2005 to honor Rev. Thomas von Behren, C.S.V., former President and Principal of Saint Viator High School, to assist any junior or senior whose family is experiencing financial difficulty and who desires to return to Saint Viator High School. Awarded to an average to above average student. Requires a counselor recommendation. (juniors and seniors only/two awards/renewable)
Elizabeth Faul Memorial Grant	\$4,900	Established by the Faul/Bidwill families in memory of their daughter Elizabeth "Lizzy" Faul, Saint Viator Class of 1988. Awarded once every four years to an incoming freshman who has demonstrated academic ability and is renewable each of the following three years. (one award/renewable)
Patrick M. Mahoney Alumni Grant	Up to \$4,000	Established in 1988 by the Alumni Association to honor Patrick M. Mahoney for his continued dedication and service to Saint Viator High School. Awarded to an incoming freshman boy who has maintained a minimum "C" average in 7th and 8th grades, taken the Saint Viator Entrance Exam and is the child of a Saint Viator alumnus/alumna or Sacred Heart of Mary alumna. (one award/renewable)
Sr. Columba Kavanagh Alumni Grant	Up to \$4,000	Established by the alumnae of Sacred Heart of Mary High School in memory of Sister Columba, second Principal of Sacred Heart. Awarded to an incoming freshman girl who has maintained a minimum "C" average in 7th and 8th grades, taken the Saint Viator Entrance Exam and is the child of a Saint Viator alumnus/alumna or Sacred Heart of Mary alumna. (one award/renewable)
James T. Bristol III Alumni Grant	Up to \$4,000	Established by the Alumni Association in honor of James T. Bristol '73, Erdmann Award winner and past President of the Alumni Association and Saint Viator Board of Trustees. Award considers academic abilities. Recipient must be a child of a Saint Viator alumnus/alumna or Sacred Heart of Mary alumna. (one award/renewable)
Diane Loss Memorial Grant	\$2,500	Established by the daughters of Diane Loss and their families in memory of their mother and grandmother, who during her lifetime stressed the importance of education and how it should be valued as a privilege. Awarded once every four years to an incoming freshman and is renewable each of the following years. (one award/renewable)
Br. Robert C. Ruhl, C.S.V. Memorial Grant	\$2,000	Established in 2008 by students, alumni, parents, colleagues, friends and family to honor a beloved Viatorian teacher, Br. Robert Ruhl, C.S.V. Br. Ruhl taught English at Saint Viator High School for nearly 37 years and inspired countless students in literature, composition and life lessons. Awarded to a student with at least a "B" average in English studies. (one award/renewable)

Title	Amount	Description
Br. Leo V. Ryan, C.S.V. Grant	\$2,000	Endowed by the friends of Br. Leo V. Ryan, C.S.V., the first President of Saint Viator High School, to honor him on the occasions of his 65th and 70th birthdays. Preference given to minority students. (three awards/renewable).
Brennan Brothers Grant	\$1,000 - \$2,000	Established by the family of the grandson/grandnephew of James and Joseph Brennan to honor their memory. Joseph had sacrificed and secretly subsidized his brother James' tuition at the former St. Viator Academy. Awarded to a student with an above average academic record and excellent discipline record. (one award/renewable)
Class of 1971 Memorial Grant	\$2,000	Established in 2003 by members of the Class of 1971 in memory of their deceased classmates. Awarded to an incoming freshman who has maintained at least a "C" average in 7th and 8th grades, has taken the Saint Viator Entrance Exam and is a child of a Saint Viator alumnus/alumna or Sacred Heart of Mary alumna. (one award/renewable)
Irish Fellowship Grant	\$500 - \$1,250	Awarded annually to a student of Irish ancestry. Requires documentation that applicant has at least two grandparents or great grandparents from the Republic of Ireland or Northern Ireland. (limited number/renewable)
Eileen J. Manno Grant	\$1,000 - \$1,250	Established in 1997 by the friends of Eileen Manno to honor her for her many years of service to Saint Viator High School, particularly as counselor and friend. (limited number/renewable)
Joseph P. Majkowski Grant	\$1,000 - \$1,250	Established in 2001 by the friends of Joe Majkowski to honor him for his many years of service to Saint Viator High School, particularly as coach, counselor and friend. (limited number/renewable)
Patrons of the Arts Grant	\$500 - \$1,000	Established to encourage the talents of visual and performing arts students. Student must have been an active member in the fine arts during his/her under-class years and be enrolled in at least one fine arts course senior year. (seniors only/one to two awards)
Alicia & Harry AuBuchon Grant	\$500 - \$1,000	Awarded to a student who is a member of St. Raymond Parish coming from a single parent household. (one award/renewable)
Rev. Robert J. Loftus Grant	\$500 - \$1,000	Established in 1995. Must be a student from St. Raymond Parish. (limited number/renewable)

PWH Educational Foundation Scholarship	\$4,900	Awarded to students who establish an above average academic record and an excellent discipline record. The scholarship is awarded to incoming freshman and is renewable each of the following three years. (renewals only)

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Title	Amount	Description
Ernest & Helen DeLord Memorial Scholarship	\$4,000	Established in memory of Ernest and Helen DeLord, who during their lifetime stressed the value of Catholic education and sacrificed to provide every educational opportunity to their children who attended St. Alphonsus School and Sacred Heart of Mary and Saint Viator High Schools. Awarded once every four years to a student with at least a "B" average who is a member of St. Alphonsus Parish. (one award/renewable)
Lori Lynch Memorial Scholarship	\$3,000 - \$4,000	Established in memory of Mrs. Lori Lynch, Director of Ministry of Care at St. Alphonsus Liguori Church, Prospect Heights. Awarded to a student with at least a "B" average in the previous two semesters. (one award/renewable)
Thomas J. Gildea Memorial Scholarship	\$3,000	Established by the Gildea family in memory of their husband/father Thomas J. Gildea. Awarded once every four years to two incoming freshmen who have maintained a minimum "B" average in 7th and 8th grades. Renewable provided recipients maintain a "B" average and are involved in at least one extra-curricular activity, program or ministry. (two awards/renewable)
Rev. Jim Johnston Scholarship	\$1,250 - \$1,500	Established in 1996 by classmates and a group of fellow clergymen known as the Runnin' Revs basketball team to honor the memory of Rev. Jim Johnston, a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago and a 1977 graduate of Saint Viator High School.
Saint Viator Scholar	\$1,000 & \$2,000	Automatically awarded to incoming freshmen who score either in the 99th or 98th percentile on the Entrance Exam. Does not require completion of Student Aid Form. (limited number/non-renewable) Please note: Saint Viator Scholar recipients are eligible to apply for need based financial assistance. Must complete 2009-10 Student Aid Form and meet all other application criteria.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES GRANTS

The following grants are awarded in the event of **unexpected financial difficulty once the school year has begun**. Contact the President any time after the start of the school year to discuss your situation if assistance becomes necessary.

Rev. Patrick Render, C.S.V. Grant	\$1,000	Established in 1993 by the Edmond Shanahan family to honor Fr. Render, C.S.V., former teacher, Dean, Principal and President, for his many years of service to Saint Viator. Awarded to a student whose family requires tuition assistance due to a job loss, death, illness, etc. (limited number/emergency grant)
Kathryn Schafer Grant	\$1,000 - \$2,000	Established in 2002 to honor Kathryn Schafer, an alumni mother and a former teacher at St. Alphonsus School. Awarded to an upperclassman whose family is experiencing serious financial difficulties. A review board will evaluate the petition and award the emergency grant as tuition assistance. (juniors/seniors only/emergency grant)
Robert C. Artman Grant	\$500 - \$1,000	Established in 1999 by the Saint Viator High School Athletic Club. Awarded to a senior whose family requires tuition assistance due to a job loss, death, illness, etc. (seniors only/emergency grant)
