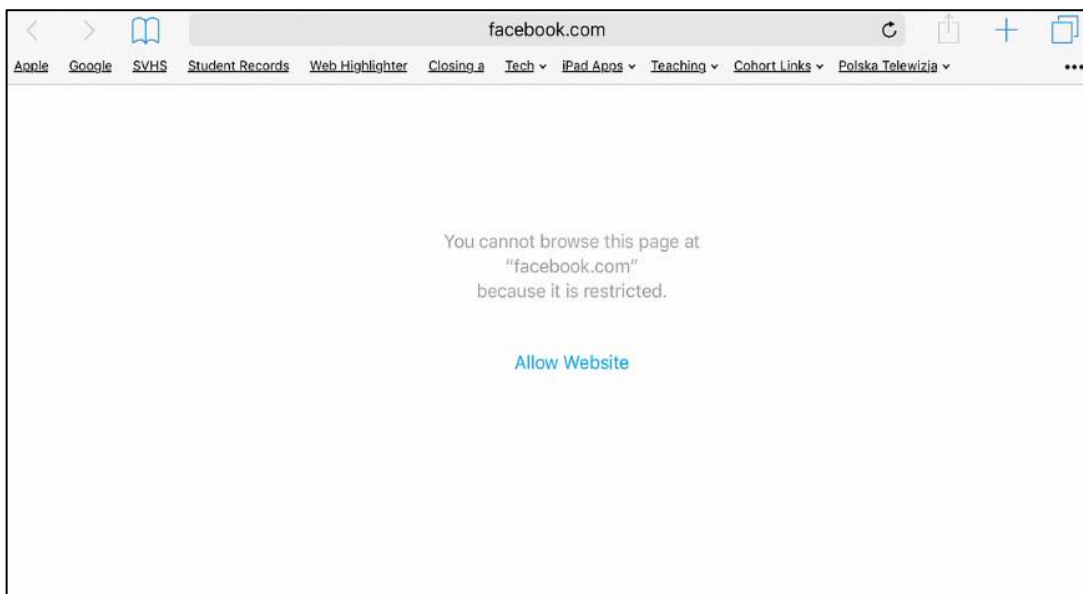


Parental Controls on the iPad

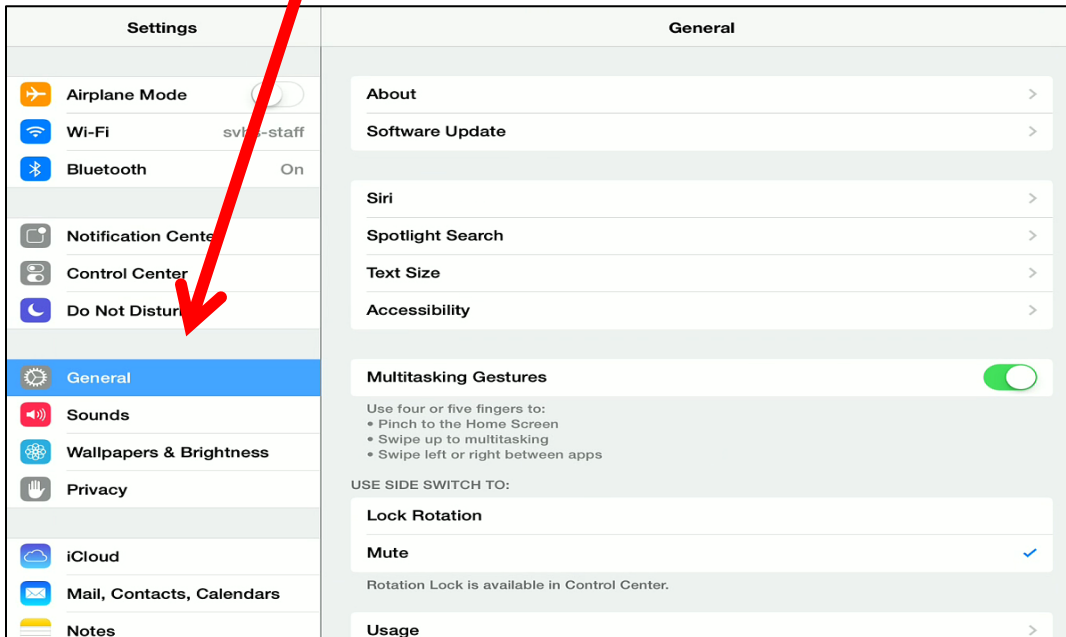


iPad Parental Controls

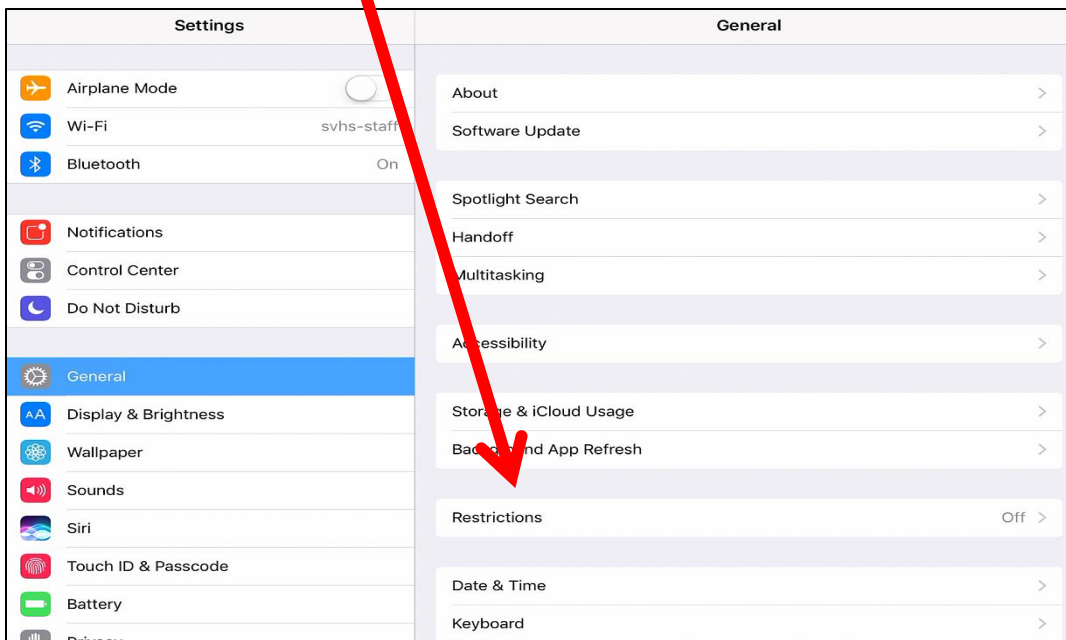
1) Go to *Settings* on the iPad.



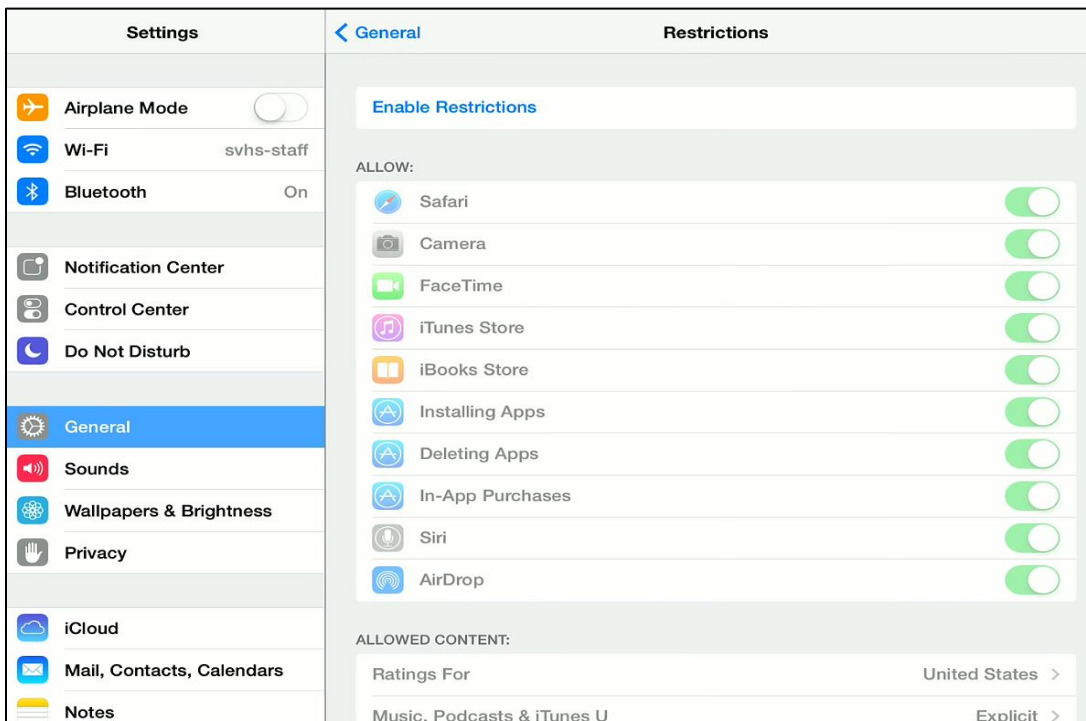
2) Once in *Settings*, tap *General*.



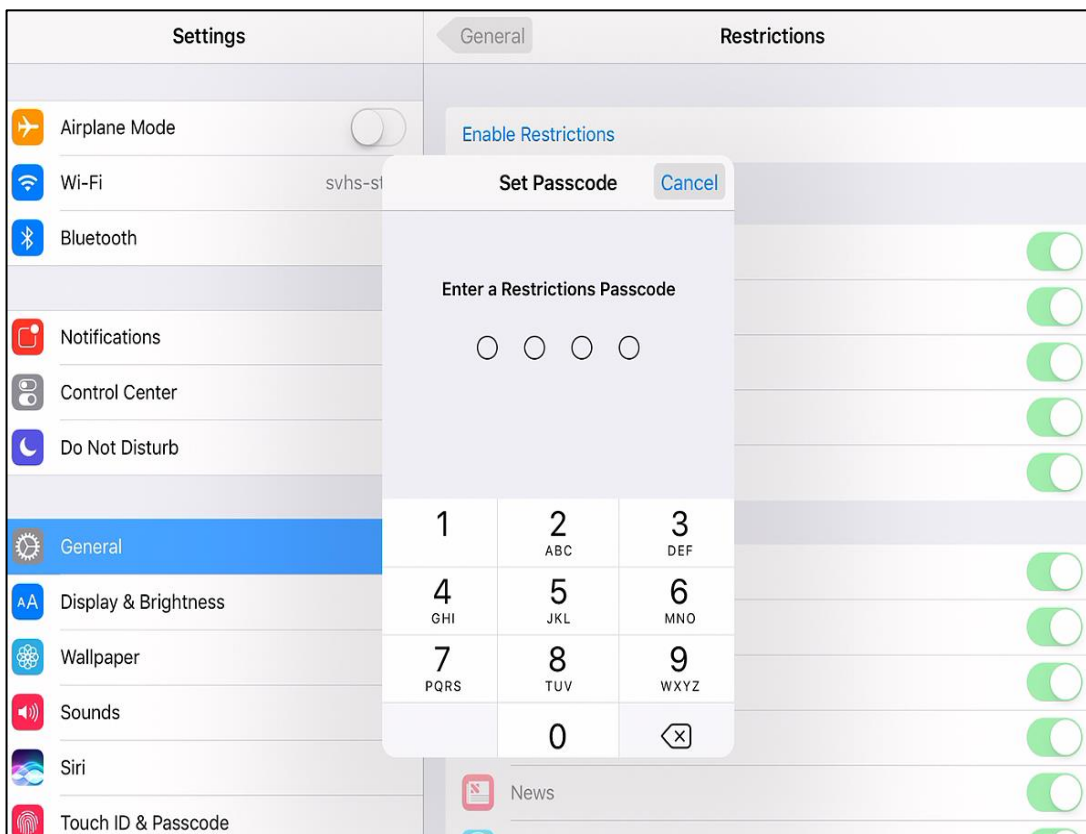
3) Scroll down a bit to *Restrictions*.



4) Tap *Restrictions*.



5) Tap *Enable Restrictions*. You will be prompted to set a Passcode; put it in twice.
*****MAKE SURE YOU CHOOSE A PASSCODE YOU WILL REMEMBER*****

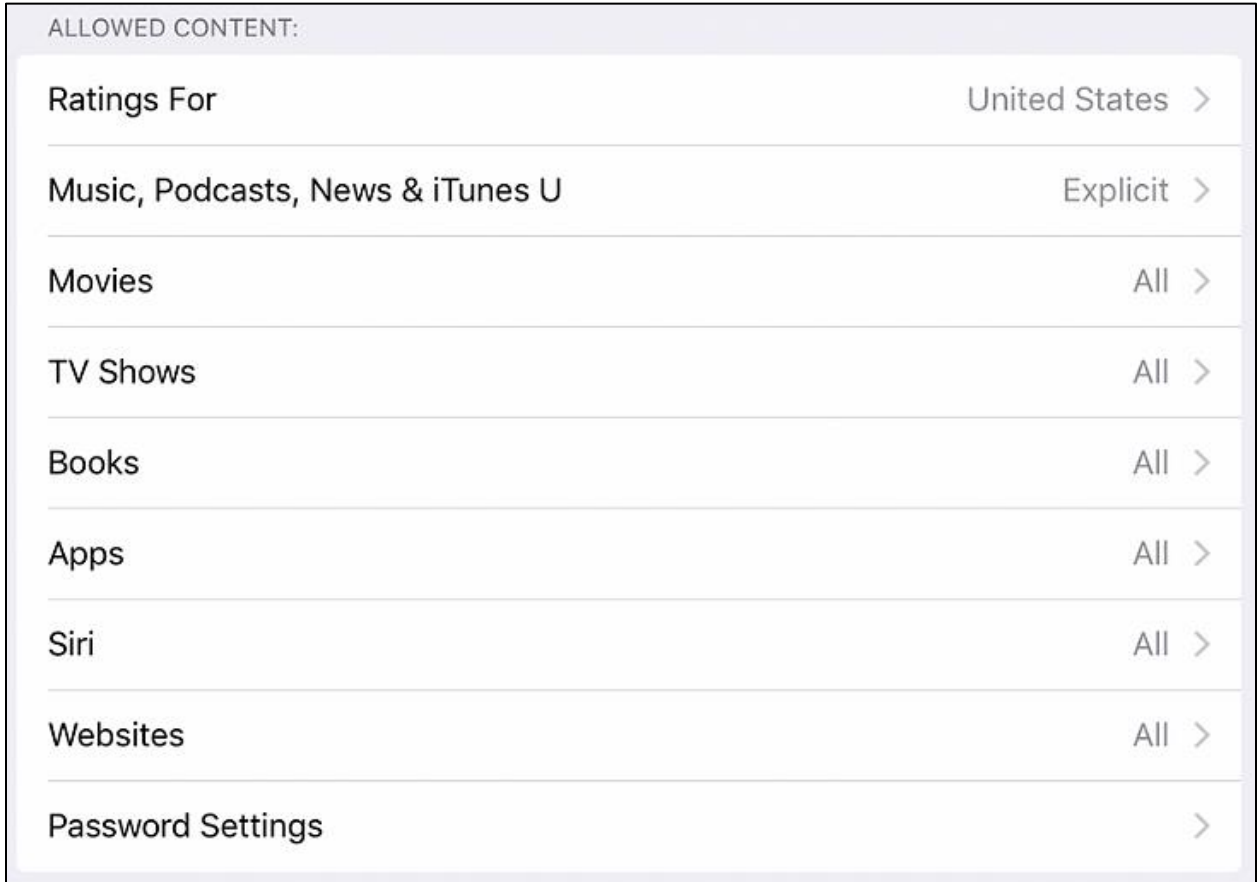


6) You now have the option to restrict many features on the iPad; below you will see what each feature is.

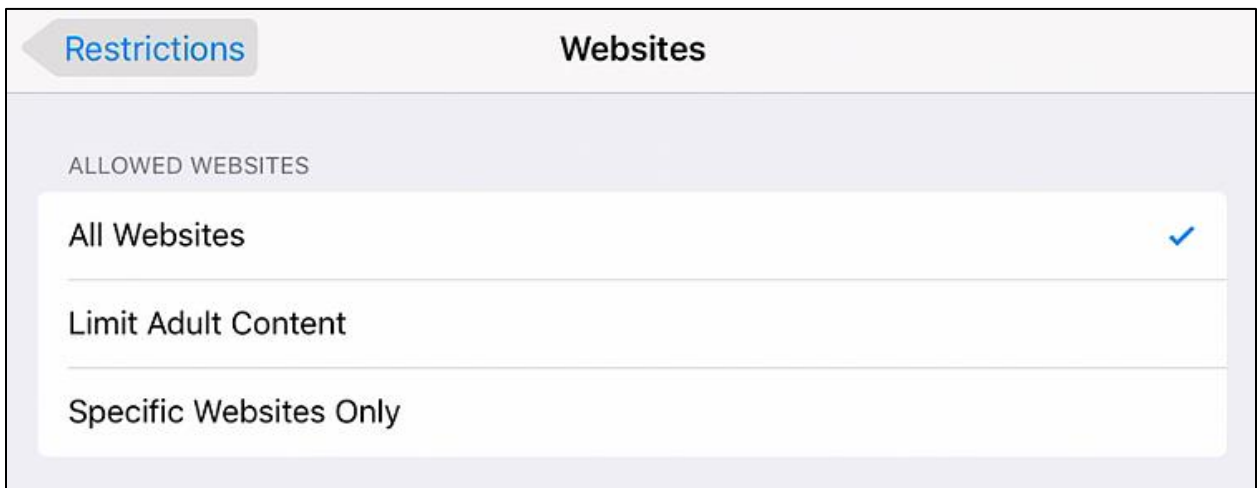

Feature	Description
Safari	iPad's default web browser, you can choose to leave this on and allow only certain
Camera	Photos and videos
Siri & Dictation	iPad's personal assistant
FaceTime	Video conferencing
AirDrop	File sharing with other iOS devices over Bluetooth; no Wi-Fi required
iTunes Store	App where you purchase and download music and videos for the iPad
Apple Music Connect	Subscription-based sharing music app
iBooks Store	App where you purchase and download books for the iPad
Podcasts	App to subscribe and listen to audio files
News	News feed
Installing Apps	App installation
Deleting Apps	App deletion
In-App Purchases	Make purchases within an app

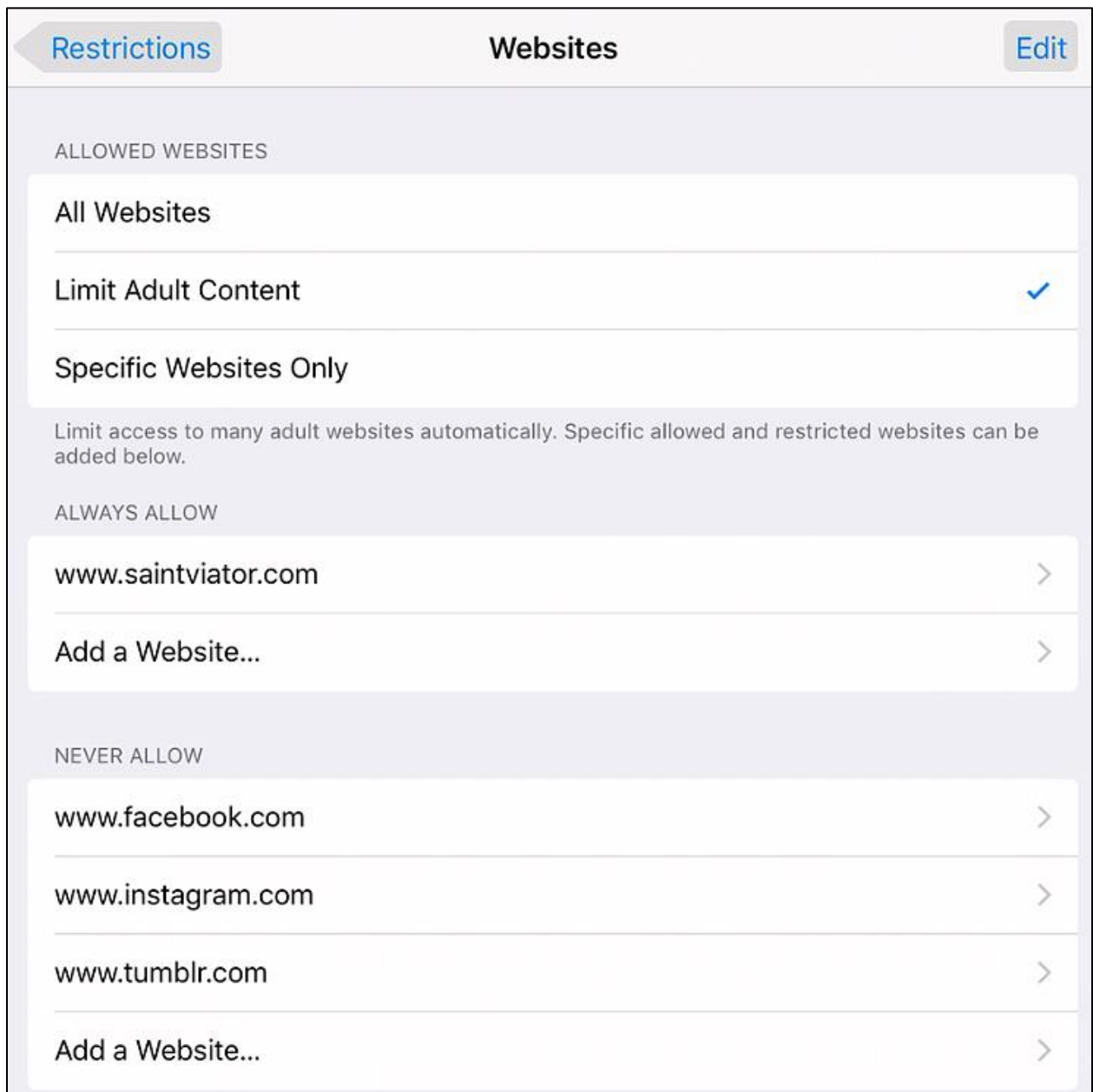
- 7) In the next section, if you choose to allow some of the iPad's features you can limit the type of content that is allowed. **For music, movies, TV Shows, Books, and Apps it is only content that is downloaded from the official iTunes store, not content from other sources.*



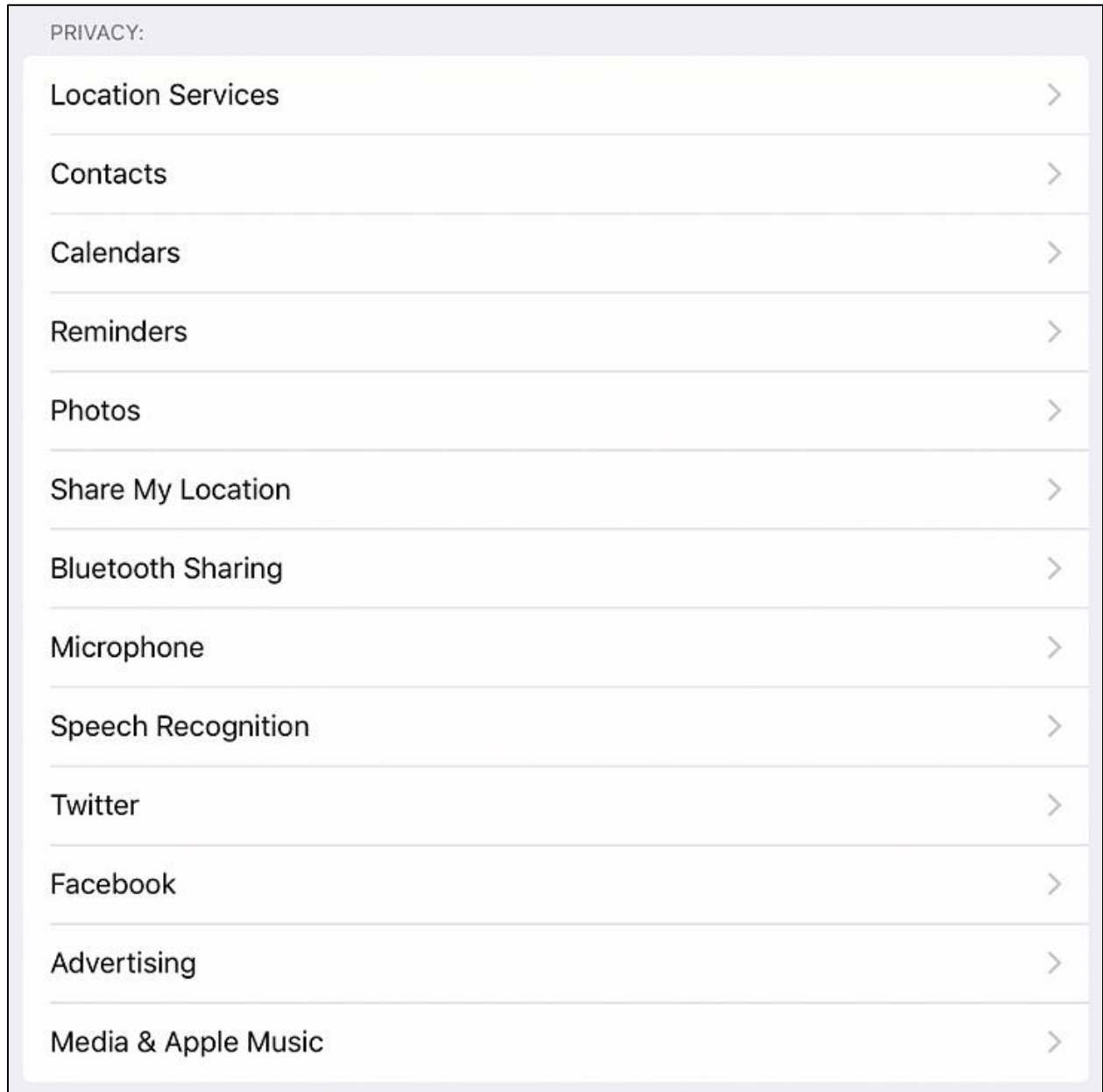
- 8) If you want to allow Safari, but only give your child access to certain websites tap *Websites*.



9) Tap *Limit Adult Content* to block certain websites; each website you want to block will need to be put in manually under *NEVER ALLOW*.



10) The next section in *Restrictions* is Privacy. You can go through each category and choose to *Allow Changes* or *Don't Allow Changes*. In certain categories you can also choose the apps that can have access to that particular feature.



- 11) The last two sections in *Restrictions* are *Allow Changes* and *Game Center*. Again, you must go through each category and choose to *Allow Changes* or *Don't Allow Changes*. In *Game Center* you can choose to disable multiplayer games, adding friends and screen recording; to disable tap to turn it non-green. This will only work in games that use Apple's *Game Center* program.
