Curriculum Statement

Saint Viator offers a college preparatory curriculum which includes courses in religious studies, language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, fine arts, health, physical education, computer science, and modern world languages. All freshmen, sophomores and juniors are required to take a minimum of six courses each semester. Seniors are required to take six courses one

semester and five the other. All classes meet five times per week for 45-minute periods, except for certain AP science labs, which meet for extended periods.

All courses in English, social studies, mathematics and modern world languages are considered college preparatory in level of difficulty. All science courses are college preparatory and are taught as laboratory sciences.
